Dear 4-H General Leaders,

The 4-H Volunteer Orientation has changed. It is now called UW-Extension Volunteer in Preparation (VIP) Training, and is expected to be completed by all volunteers in UW Extension programs. Because of this change, the state decided that the VIP Training would be the focus of the Annual 4-H Club Chartering training. In your club you can attend as the general leader, or you can have other leaders attend (newly enrolled leaders, too!). The requirement is that someone from each club attend the training. I have included the steps to be a UW-Extension volunteer.

Steps Needed to be a UW-Extension Volunteer

(does not need to be completed sequentially; but all steps are required to be a UW-Extension volunteer.)

- Application which includes: Signed Volunteer Behavior Expectation Form and Assumption of Risk
- Online Mandatory Reporter Training for Volunteers (required for all new volunteers as of Sept. 2016)
- UW-Extension Volunteer in Preparation (VIP) Training
- Successful Background Check

1. Signed Volunteer Behavior Expectation Form and the Assumption of Risk Statement Complete either online or paper (including agreeing to the Volunteer Behavior Expectation

Form and the Assumption of Risk statement).

2. Online Mandatory Reporter Training for Volunteers

All volunteers are required to complete the online UW-Extension Mandated Reporter Training for Extension Volunteers.

- This section is completed by the volunteer independently and/or with the support from the county office using the 4HOnline database.
- Volunteers get to this link under trainings in 4HOnline. This is tracked in 4HOnline.

3. Successful Background Check

This is done at the state level by UW-Extension Human Resources. All new volunteers will have a background check run. The names will be pulled from the county database of new volunteers.

Allow at least two weeks for the results.

The date of the Background Check will be recorded in 4HOnline at the state level.

3a. Unsuccessful Background Check

What if a check has limitations, restrictions or a background check fails?

- 1) The Associate Program Director will work with UW-Extension HR to discuss limitations with you prior to any communication being sent to the volunteer.
- 2) Volunteer limitation letters sent by UW-Extension Human Resources.
- 3) Staff will be copies on any limitations communicated to the volunteer.
- 4) Background check information needs to be kept in a secure locked location.

5. Complete the UW-Extension Volunteer in Preparation (VIP) Training

The VIP Training is designed to take approximately 2 hours to teach.

6. Communication to Volunteers

Volunteer Acceptance Letter to volunteers after completion of training, background check and online Mandated Reporter Training link.

Volunteer in Preparation (VIP) Training (Volunteer Orientation)

In 2016, the Youth Protection/Volunteer Orientation changed to become the Volunteer in Preparation Training. The training is different than what many general leaders have gone through as volunteers. Therefore the state decided that we would use the Volunteer in Preparation as the Annual Leader Training for the 2016-'17 4-H year.

The Volunteer in Preparation provides an opportunity for Extension staff to provide a general orientation to UW-Extension and principles in working with youth. This training is fundamental to the orientation of volunteers. It is required for all new volunteers and returning volunteers are welcome to attend again.

UW-Extension relies on volunteers to implement programming in 4-H Youth Development, Master Gardener Program, Family Living and Community Resource Development. Volunteers work with staff to develop and implement programs in counties and areas statewide. There are over 20,000 volunteers in Cooperative Extension.

It is essential that every volunteer within UW-Extension complete the entire portion of volunteer orientation and the extension office can document their successful completion of orientation.

Just a reminder, the General Leader is not necessarily the person that needs to attend the Annual Leader Training—it can be any adult from your club. Please feel free to invite others to attend. RSVP by NOVEMBER 11. <u>SIGN UP</u> ONLINE HERE or return clipout.

- 1. MUSICAL—primarily singing or instrumental (interpretation of selections with costumes and/or actions is appropriate)
- 2. DANCE—any type of dance & recorded/live music
- MUSICAL PANTOMIME—includes lipsync, rap, improvisation, etc.
- 4. DRAMA—all clubs/individuals bring their own props
- MINI-ACTS—A mini-performance act can be any performance of interest. Suggested performances include: musical acts, mini-dramas, dance routines, interpretive readings, comedy routines, and juggling acts. Vocalists and instrumentalists are especially encouraged to perform.

Note: There may not be a piano. There may be a keyboard available, if we are able to locate one. Any suggestions you have would be appreciated.

Rules:

- Participants MUST be an enrolled 4-H member for the current year.
- Leader/non 4-H member can accompany with instrument, but cannot sing.
- One top award will be given in each division for drama & music. If more than 5 clubs in a division, runner-up award will be given.
- Top clubs in music & drama may represent Dodge Co. at the WI State Fair if entry meets State Fair criteria.
- Alld clubs/participants recognized and receive a music or drama ribbon. Dest activing awards will be given in Drama entries.
- The stage is not available for practice.
- GROUP acts will have ONLY 20 minutes on stage WHICH INCLUDES setup and takedown time. We recommend performances last approximately 10 minutes. GROUP performances must consist of 5 or more members.
- INDIVIDUAL acts will have only 10 minutes on stage including setup and takedown. We recommend performances last approximately 5-8 minutes. Acts have 1-5 performers.
- Oral critiques are given after EACH performance.

PLAY ACTING

An entry in the Play Acting category is a presentation of a scene or cutting from a play by a group of two to seven participants. Lines are to be spoken from memory, if possible and participants are expected to move, as they would in a fully produced play. The goal of this category is to provide a group of students with the opportunity of working together for a presentation using their voices and bodies to suggest the intellectual, emotional and sensory experiences inherent in the dramatic material they have chosen. Learning to work together to achieve a desired goal is one of the experiences students can gain from participation in this category.

Rules to Follow

- An entry in this category is a presentation by a group of 2-7 students of a scene or cutting from a play.
- The presentation material should be memorized.
- The group presentation is to be given without costumes, make-up, lights or properties. A table (desk as a substitute) and chairs may be used if available or provided by the participants. Music and mechanical or electronic sound effects are also prohibited.
- In this category the emphasis is on character development, interaction of the characters on stage (on-stage focus), and appropriate physical movement/blocking to bring the characters to life.
- One of the criteria for evaluating the presentation will be the effective use of the time allowed. A presentation in this category shall not exceed twelve (12) minutes in length, including a required introduction and any transitions the group in this category. wishes to make. Even though there is no minimum time limit, it is strongly recommended that the group use a majority of the maximum time for an effective presentation. At the end of fifteen minutes, the timekeeper or judge shall stand and the student speaking should complete the sentence begun.

READERS THEATER

The goal of this category is to provide a group of 2-7 participants with the opportunity of working together for a presentation using their voices to suggest the intellectual, emotional and sensory experiences inherent in the material they have chosen. Learning to work together to achieve a desired goal is one of the experiences students can gain from participation in this category. 4.

Rules to Follow

- An entry in this category is a presentation by a group of 2-7 students. The source material may be prose, poetry, essay, drama - or a combination of these forms. The material may be either original or non-original.
- The presentation material must be read from the printed 2.
- The group presentation is to be given without costumes, make-up, lights or properties. Music and mechanical or electronic sound effects are also prohibited. The optional uses of chairs, stools or reading stands provided by the participants are permitted.
- In this category the emphasis is on creating the action through oral interpretation for the audience without direct

- interaction (no eye contact or touching) among the participants. Participants should maintain off-stage focus. The presentation should let the audience imagine the action rather than witness it. General gestures and movement may be used to enhance a performance, but they should not be pantomimed or acted. Appropriate handling of scripts is also a consideration.
- 5. One of the criteria for evaluating the presentation will be the effective use of the time allowed. A presentation in this category shall not exceed twelve (12) minutes in length, including a required introduction and any transitions the group wishes to make. Even though there is no minimum time limit, it is strongly recommended that the group use a majority of the maximum time for an effective presentation. At the end of fifteen minutes the timekeeper or judge shall stand and the student speaking should complete the sentence begun.

SOLO ACTING:

Participation in this category provides a student with the opportunity of using voice, gesture and facial expression to convey understanding and the emotional, intellectual and sensory experiences that are a part of the chosen selection. To tell a story through pantomime is also acceptable in this category. The material may be either original or non-original in content and may include impersonations from television, records or tape recordings. As a note of caution, however, it should be remembered that this type of material is usually protected by copyright and permission must be secured from the copyright holder before use

Rules to Follow

- An entry in this category should be memorized. Pantomime is also acceptable. The source material may be prose, poetry, drama or essay and may be either original or nonoriginal. Impersonations are allowed.
- Whether the selection is oral or mime, original or nonoriginal, the participant shall present an introduction and also give any transitions needed to establish a relationship between parts of the presentation.
- 3. Movement is limited only by what is appropriate to the material and the style of the presentation.
- The presentation shall be performed without the use of costumes, make-up, lighting or properties. A chair or stool and table may be used if available or are provided by the stu-
- 5. One of the criteria for evaluating the presentation will be the effective use of the time allowed. An entry in this category shall be no more than eight (8) minutes in length. Even though there is no minimum time limit, it is strongly recommended that the student use a majority of the maximum time for an effective presentation. At the end of eight minutes, the timekeeper or judge shall stand and the participant should complete the sentence or the action begun.

GUIDELINES & CRITERIA FOR 4-H GRANTS

Sponsored by Dodge County 4-H Leaders Association, Inc.

Who can apply?

Any Dodge County 4-H member and/or leader can apply on behalf of his/her Dodge County 4-H club; any Dodge County 4-H subcommittee or group; Dodge County 4-H Leaders Association, Inc.; and/or Dodge County UW-Extension agent.

What are the funding criteria?

Preference will be given to projects that meet the following criteria:

- Projects with an innovative or educational purpose,
- Projects open to all of your club's members, and
- Projects that increase awareness of 4-H in your community.
- Projects with a community service focus.

Projects with the same activity and same target audience will **not** be funded a second time.

What are the application procedures?

- Grant Application deadlines are January 31 and June 30.
- Applications will be reviewed by the Dodge County 4-H Endowment Fund Committee in February and July respectively.
- A letter announcing results will be sent to youth and adult contact person after March 1 and August 1 respectively.
- Recommendations are approved by the 4-H Leader's Executive Board.
- If funding is awarded, a check will be sent with the results letter.
- Funds are limited for request up to \$500. Grants will NOT cover total cost of the project. If application has no matching-type funds, time can serve as a monetary value for completion of activity. Include this information on your grant application.
- Not all applications submitted may receive funding.
- Application must be completed and submitted by a member and leader.
- Clubs may submit up to two (2) grant applications per year.
- A follow-up on project must be submitted to the Dodge County 4-H Endowment Fund Committee within 30 days of completing the project or activity. The follow-up will consist of one (1) paragraph on what the members learned, photographs, and any other supporting material in relation to the project along with a Grant completion form. An article for the 4-H Newsletter must accompany this final report. Receipts must be included. The project must be completed within one year of application date.
- Funds not used within the one year time frame, must be returned to the Dodge County 4-H Endowment Fund
- Fill out the enclosed application and send to the Dodge County 4-H Endowment Fund Committee, 127 E Oak St, Juneau WI 53039.
