Who can join 4-H?

Any youth, kindergarten through one year beyond high school graduation (grade 13) is eligible to join a 4-H club. 4-H is open to everyone regardless of race, color, sex, national origin, or handicap. Adults can become involved as volunteer leaders.

Is 4-H just for farm kids?

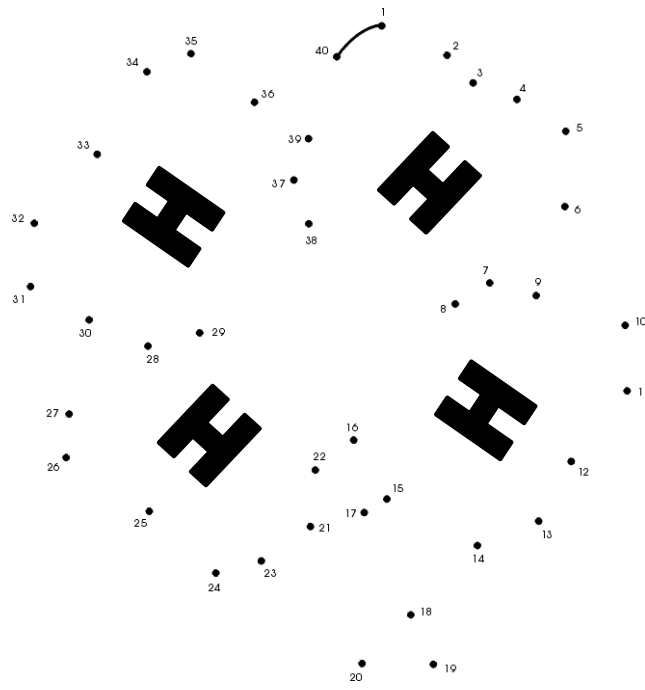
4-H is open to all youth in both rural and urban areas. In addition to animals, 4-H projects include Arts & Crafts, Music, Woodworking, Photography, Flowers, and so much more!

What does a 4-H club do?

A 4-H club elects its own officers and conducts its own business. Each club meets monthly with an annual plan for programs. Each meeting usually includes a special fun educational program.
